TRAINING RURAL TRAINERS WITH MAMPRUSI FINISHED


We will follow up once a month with additional tools for discipleship and work with them on reporting. Four groups have formed and so far four baptisms. Several others are waiting for rain to have water to baptize.

The traditional view of discerning spiritual maturity is based on perceived knowledge accumulated through attendance in groups and classes. After they have proven faithful by attendance they are selected to teach others. But this approach is unhealthy because group attendance does not show what is being obeyed from what they have learned. A healthier way is to make sure that people within groups are sharing what from the scripture they will obey or put into practice this week and then be held accountable the following week as to how they did. Also listening to people answer questions like, "What makes you happy about the story?",

"What make sad about the story?", "What did you learn about the character of God from the story?", "What did you learn about the character of man from the story?" and "How will you obey what you learned in the story?" lets everyone know immediately if the person is understanding the story and appropriately applying it. Jesus said, "Everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock." Matt. 7.

Spiritual maturity is measured by what we are putting into practice and doesn't every require literacy.

Setting the Pace for the Unreached


FROM THE PRESIDENT
