Our team enjoyed a picnic lunch at the falls, celebrated Mike's birthday and ended the day with fireworks.

May and June have been very busy months. We held two trainings (see photos by clicking here and then clicking on the Bole Kairos Training gallery and the Akosomobo Jonathan Training gallery).

The Grahams planted a new church in Billisikura. It is going great composed mostly of the unreached Chokossi people group.

We began construction on additional recording studios at Ghana Institute of Linguistics, Literacy and Bible Translation (GILLBT). See photo.

We also picked up three Team Expansion interns just in time to attend the Kairos Training we taught in Bole. They have been helpful in multiple ways: such as helping plant gardens, teaching health lessons, playing with the children, participating in prayer walks in Billisikura, the village next to our house, copying micros sd chips containing Bible tools to be used in cell phones, and helping with many

things around the Permaculture Center like watering and feeding our goats, sheep and rabbits. They also got to shop at the Buipe market every Monday and took turns cooking the meals and doing the dishes. We also enjoyed playing different card games together at night before going to bed. More than half of their time is already up and we will miss them greatly when they leave.

It was exciting after church yesterday last Sunday to learn that four ladies wanted to be baptized. We all gathered at our house and baptized them in our pond. In addition Isaac just called and told me that last week Moses also had four baptisms - two from the Gonia tribe and two from the Dagomba tribe. Great things are happening. P.T.L.!

It seems like a whirlwind since the beginning of May. We completed thirteen weeks of simple church planting in Walewale with some Mamprusi leaders, then headed right into a week of Jonathan training at Akosombo, 12 hours south with twenty- six leaders from all over Ghana. Then I traveled back to the south (only I flew this time:)) to meet our three Team Expansion Pathways interns -Tim, Sara & Caleb. After a week of orientation we traveled with them to Bole, 3 hours west, for a Kairos course with a group of 39. It was a great week of learning together and the interns' first introduction to Ghanaian food. Since then they and the Grahams have been working hard. They are up at 6am to work for a couple of hours at the Permaculture Training Center, then a quick breakfast and off to work on the training gardens. After lunch is language learning with Hezekiah and then afternoon Bible story and health lesson visits in Bilisikura. They are also helping with the small provisions store we opened this month where we've starting selling our honey and dried mushrooms.

In everything, God has been so faithful. We seek God in everything, asking Him to give us His wisdom for this journey. As part of the journey with our interns, we are working through a devotional by David Nasser called "A Call To Die." In it we are reminded that we are called to die to ourselves, take up the instrument of our death and follow Him along the path of radical obedience. He isn't demanding it, just offering it up. We have a choice. Do we allow our selfish ambitions to rise above other people; our behaviors to get what we want when we want it; our caring only for our own interests; or our desire to put our needs before others drive our walk with Christ? This is the stuff of the "hungry wolf" that consumes anything and everything it can eat. To deny ourselves is just to not feed it.

God is teaching us much! Thank you for being on this journey with us. We are nothing without you and we thank God every day for each of you and your partnership in the Gospel bringing the light of salvation to the unreached of Ghana, West Africa. Thank you!
