Last month a village in Cote d'Ivoire, Gandie, was burned to the ground by a group of Burkinabae over a land dispute. The raid took place in the middle of the night so everyone fled their homes in their night clothes. Everything was destroyed except the school and the temporary shelter set up by the DMM team. The five DMM'ers living in this village were not harmed but everything they owned was lost including the farm implements with which they earn a small income.





...but relief came from believers in Ghana, Cote d'Ivoire and beyond. A group from Abidjan purchased clothes, food, farm implements, mattresses, and so much more.



Leaders of various groups came to express their disappointment in their 'god' who couldn't do anything to help them either against this incident or help them after that. They said they have seen the love shown them in time of extreme need and pray that this act of love will forever be before God as sweet smelling sacrifice. Lives have been touched and a beacon of light has come to a remote region of the earth.
